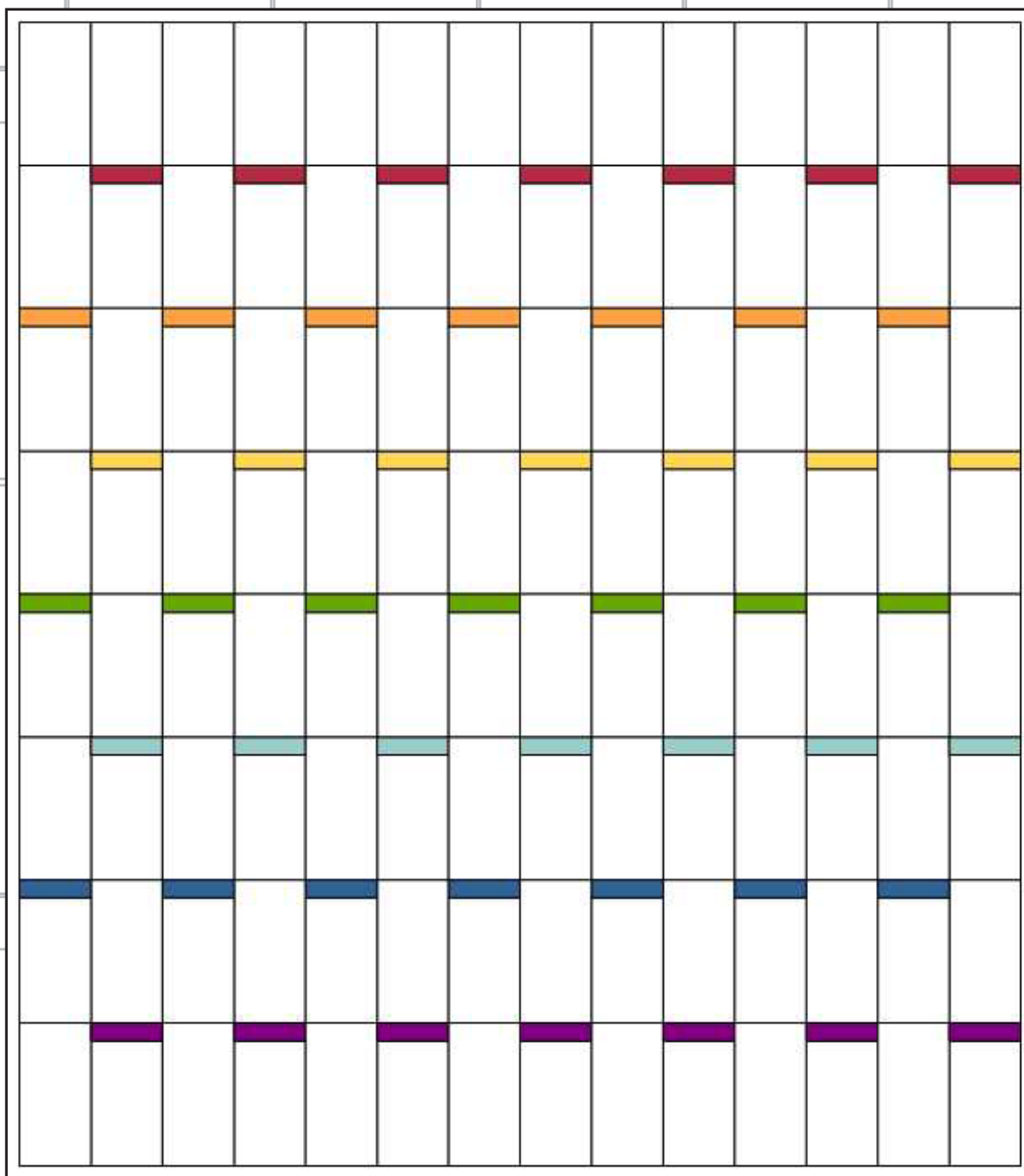

B	¹ / ₈ YARD
C	¹ / ₈ YARD
D	¹ / ₈ YARD
E	¹ / ₈ YARD
F	¹ / ₈ YARD
G	¹ / ₈ YARD
H	¹ / ₈ YARD

ABOUT

The Freeway Quilt Pattern is a fun and playful project that is perfect for a quick gift or as your daily couch snuggler. This pattern works great for children and doubles as a fun road playmat!

NOTES

Skill Level:
Beginner

Finished Size:
56" x 64"

Fabric Width:
All fabric widths are assumed to be 42"

Pressing:
Press open to reduce bulk or all in same direction to create smoothness at seams.

Fabric Substitutions:

These instructions and fabric requirements are written for quick strip piecing. However, if you wish to use scraps, you will need to cut (7) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces for each row for a total of (49). Additionally, you will need to cut (49) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $7\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces to pair with them. You will sew the $4\frac{1}{2}$ " sides together, press, and then continue to piece the quilt according to original instructions.

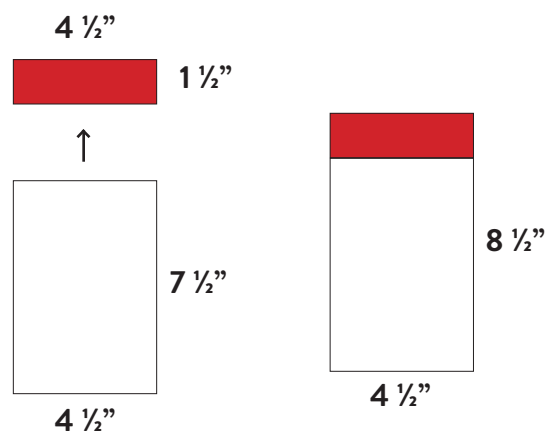
Terminology/Abbreviations

WOF = Width of Fabric

RST = Right Sides Together

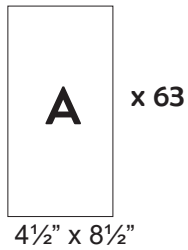
STRIP PIECE = Sewing together long, continuous fabric cuts (strips)

SUBCUT = A cut made from fabric that has already been cut or sewn

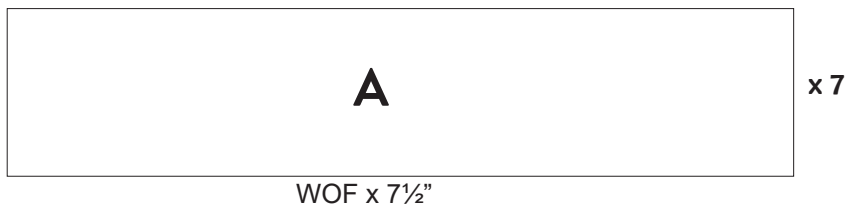


CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

1. Cut (63) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles of Fabric A.



2. Cut (7) WOF x $7\frac{1}{2}$ " strips of Fabric A.



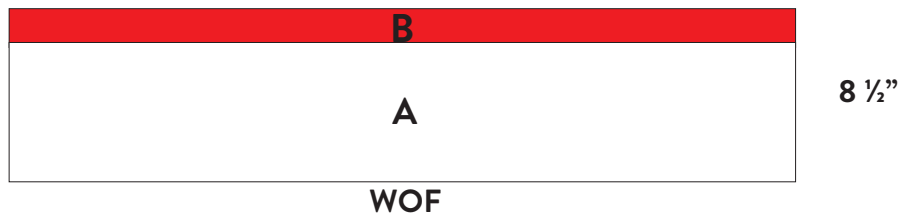
3. Cut (1) WOF x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " strips of Fabrics B, C, D, E, F, G and H.



PIECING

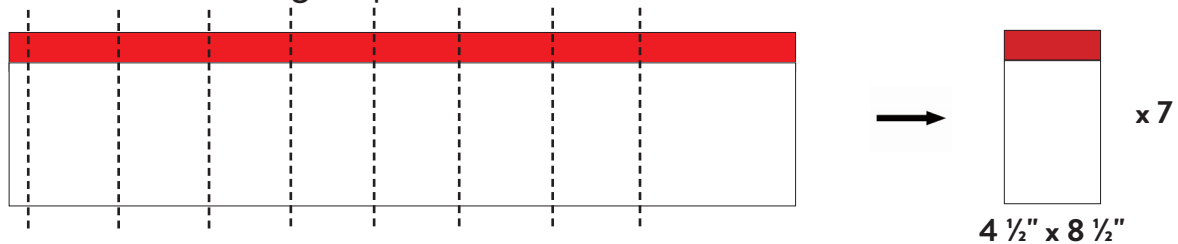
1. **Sew** (1) Fabric A WOF x $7\frac{1}{2}$ " strip to the Fabric B WOF x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " strip along the long edge RST to make a strip set.

Repeat and pair the remaining Fabric A strips with each Fabric C, D, E, F, G, and H strips. Press all strip sets.



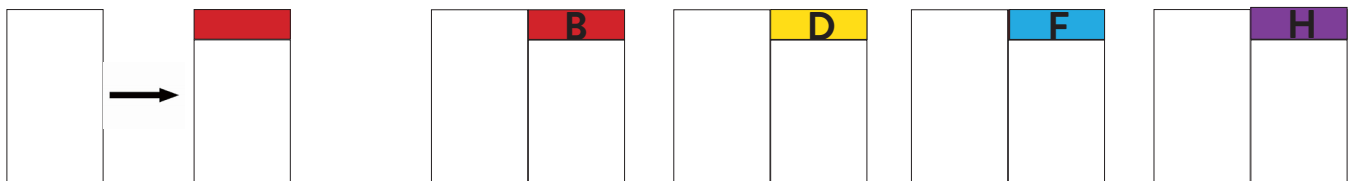
2. **Subcut** (7) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces from the strip set.

Repeat with each remaining strip set (C, D, E, F, G and H).



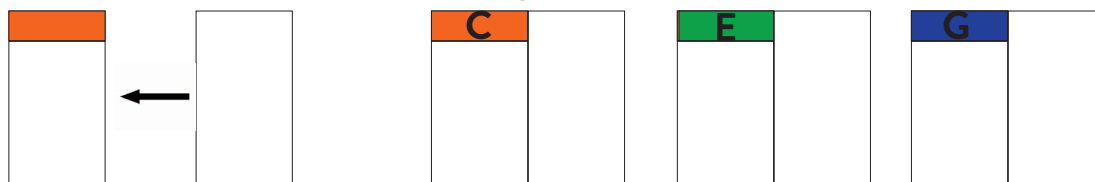
3. **Sew** (1) Fabric A piece to the **left** edge of each subcut piece with Fabric B to make (1) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Press.

Repeat with all subcuts containing Fabrics D, F, and H. Press.



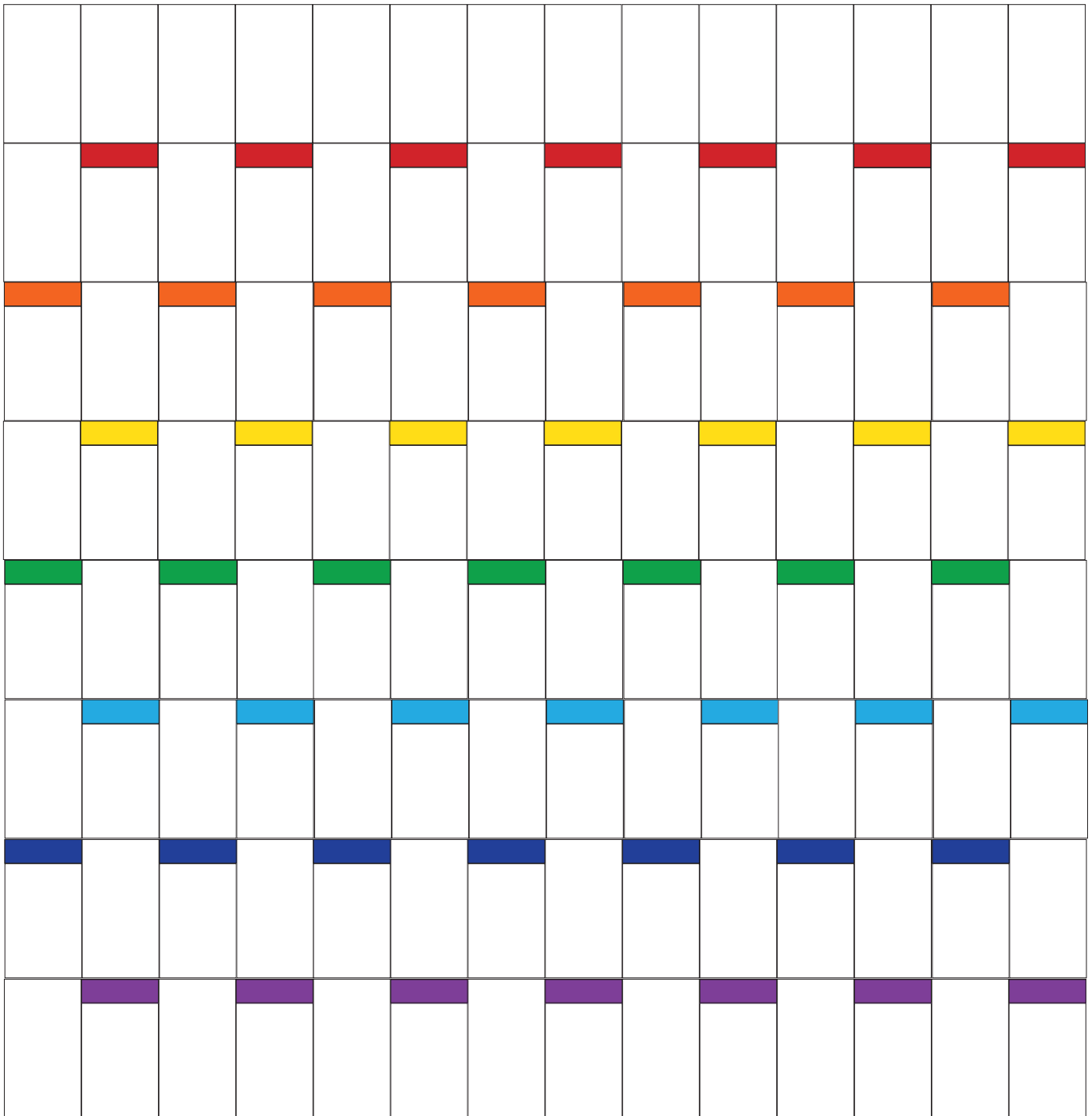
4. **Sew** (1) Fabric A piece to the **right** edge of each subcut piece with Fabric C to make (1) $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Press.

Repeat with all subcuts containing Fabrics E and G. Press.



5. **SEW** remaining (14) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A pieces together along their long edges to create Row 1.

1. **SEW** all (8) rows together to complete the quilt top.
